Registered EEG Technologist – Regular Full-Time EEG Services

EEG services at LHSC provides comprehensive patient-centred care and contributes to the understanding of epilepsy through diagnostic investigation, education and research. Reporting to the Manager of the EEG Lab, the Registered EEG Technologist is responsible for performing electroencephalograms related electrophysiological diagnostic activity. Other responsibilities may include, but are not limited to, 24-hour monitoring in the 8-bed Epilepsy Unit, including video monitoring; 24-hour monitoring of patients with surgically implanted (invasive) subdural/or grid electrodes; Assisting the physician with cortical stimulation with invasive subdural and/or grid electrodes; Performing prolonged EEGs intraoperatively, and conducting EEG research.

Rate of Pay: \$27.05/hour to \$31.15/hour

Hours of Work: 37.5 hours per week

QUALIFICATIONS:

- College/University undergraduate degree in health sciences, information technology or biomedical fields is required
- Certification by the Canadian Board of Registered EEG Technologists (CBRET)
- Well-developed patient assessment, planning, intervention and evaluation skills

- Demonstrated ability to prioritize multiple and changing demands that require attention to detail in a high volume environment
