### **Your Opportunity:**

The Electroneurophysiology (EEG) Technologist I performs standard neurophysiology tests on adults, children and infants. This includes EEG, long term video monitoring and may include Evoked Potentials. The EEG Technologist I will primarily carry out EEG studies to support service delivery within the Clinical Neurophysiology program and will perform testing in an outpatient setting, in the ICU and emergency departments. This is skilled technical work involving the measurement and recording of brain waves to obtain data to assist in the diagnosis of neurological disorders. Relocation assistance may be offered for eligible candidates in accordance with AHS policy. This is a multisite position in the Edmonton Zone. The primary location is to be determined and is subject to change.

### **Description:**

As an Electroneurophysiology (EEG) Technologist, you will perform appropriate tests on all age groups, utilizing a variety of electrode application methods and explain testing procedures to clients/patients and family. You will observe physical changes in the patient during testing, prepare results and/or interprets findings for/with physician.

You will prepare, update and maintain patient records. You will ensure proper operation of equipment by performing maintenance, calibration, cleaning and detect any equipment malfunction, make minor repairs or report the need for major repairs to the appropriate person. You will inform the physician of urgent examination results and resolve unusual or complex cases or refers concerns to the appropriate individual(s).
